EXPANDS OPERATIONS IN STIRLING

Clinical Research Organisation (CRO) Medpace has anchored its second UK base in Stirling where it is hoping to start recruiting personnel over the next few weeks. The new office at Stirling University Innovation Park (SUIP) brings the total number of Medpace offices to 12 across Europe.

The Medpace office in Scotland provides additional safety services required for global adverse event management, to allow pharmaceutical and medical device products to enter the market safely. This continued investment in Europe from the Cincinnati company headquarters, has allowed the organisation to deliver its services across Europe.

“With a quickly expanding European group of clinical expertise and infrastructure, Medpace continues to grow to support clinical studies conducted in Europe. The Stirling base is yet another string to our bow in northern Europe,” noted Dr Seitz-Tutter, Vice President, Europe.

With more than 1000 employees and clinical trial experience in over 40 countries, Medpace creates partnerships with pharmaceutical and biotechnology companies to provide the path to drug development, from programme planning to product delivery.

This move into Stirling has occupied over 1200 sq ft to house the anticipated 6 recruits in clinical safety and clinical operations. The central location in Scotland is of benefit in supporting both safety and clinical operations in Europe.

Lynn Blaikie, the Park’s Business Development Manager was keen to see another Life Sciences business entering the Park and making such a firm commitment to Scotland in its European operations. She noted, “ We have an excellent pool of talent within a 50 mile radius of Stirling, and this, coupled with the ease of access for international travel makes it an ideal location for Medpace. The serviced office space allows ease of day to day operation even when key personal may be out of the country.

“This addition to the Park is not only a major new addition for Stirling, but it is a significant asset for the Life Sciences community in Scotland.”
